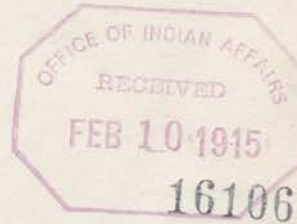

Sir:

I enclose herewith request for authority to expend \$1,000 payable from appropriation, "Indian School, Carlisle, Pa., 1914, Repairs and Improvements," in the employment of student labor, skilled and unskilled, required for making general repairs and improvements at the Carlisle Indian School.

The records of this office show that from January 1, 1913, to January 31, 1914, there was paid out for irregular labor to white persons the sum of \$6,539. I have talked this matter over with the various shop instructors and they informed me that we have a number of large boys who have been learning trades and who are competent under the direction of their instructors to do all of the repair work required at this school. Many of these boys in order to earn a little money quit their trades and go out to the country and work on farms at small wages, when they should be working at their trades. My idea would be to pay them not to exceed \$1.00 per day and down as low as perhaps 10¢ per day, depending upon their skill and ability to render service. This plan has been followed at the Chilocco school many years and has always worked very satisfactorily. The average wage will probably not exceed



50¢ per day, whereas we pay skilled white mechanics and laborers two or three times that amount.

Please give this matter prompt attention and advise me as soon as possible what action the Office takes in regard to it.
