Sir:

I respectfully report that Peter Jordan, a 1/2 blood member of the Chippewa Tribe at Red Lake, Minn., was enrolled at this school from 1907 to 1910. He was also enrolled from September of 1910 to April of 1911, when he was released to accept a position at the Hayward School in Wisconsin. He was then enrolled from September of 1911 to June of 1912, and on December 10th of last year he again came to this school.

Peter was given a diploma yesterday and has now requested that transportation be provided for his use to his home. In view of the fact that he is now 26 years of age and because he has not been enrolled for a full year since the termination of his first period of enrolment I have told him that his wishes can not be carried out until authority to do so has been received,

I desire that the Office instruct me what action to take.
