My dear Mr. Carter:

I have your letter of May 29, forwarding a communication from Mr. Jackson Moore, who asks for information concerning the Carlisle Indian School.

Under a rule of the Department, members of the Five Civilized Tribes are not admitted to this school, unless upon payment of their expenses for transportation to and fro, and also tuition at the rate of \$167. per annum, which charge for tuition includes their subsistence, clothing, lodging, etc. while at the school.

As to the school work, industrial and otherwise, the Supervisor in Charge has been directed to mail to Mr. Moore a catalog and any other literature which may give him further information.

The letter of your correspondent is returned.
