I return herewith the communications that were transmitted for my information with Office letter of August the 19th. The Millissa Anderson referred to has been returned to her home and I submit below a copy of the letter that was addressed to the mother of the girl:

"I regret to advise that the letter with which you enclosed a ten dollar Money Order to pay for your daughter Millissa's transportation home was not received here until this morning. It has been arranged, however, so that she can leave here tomorrow evening and you have been notified by wire that you may expect her to arrive at Buffalo on Friday morning. (Aug. 14th)

Complying with Millissa's suggestion a ticket for her passage only to Buffalo will be procured for her use, but the balance of the amount you sent that is not required for transportation will be handed to her for her transportation from Buffalo to your home by such routing as you may then desire to take."

you by the Office of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
on July the 6th, and in which you were informed that I
"will arrange for her return as soon as you have remitted
the necessary amount", meaning your daughter Melissa, I
desire to know how soon I may expect to receive the amount
required to pay for her transportation.

Melissa is not making good use of her time, is not a good influence among the girls, and it is my opinion that she cannot be expected to make very much improvement while she remains here. Under the circumstances I would prefer to have her leave as soon as possible, and I would thank you to let me hear from you without delay.

Madam:

Referring further to your letter of June 15, asking for the return of your daughter Melissa from the Carliele School, you are informed that the Supervisor in Charge has forwarded all the correspondence with you concerning the matter. From this correspondence it appears that you did not make a definite request for return home of your daughter, although in your letter to the Office you say that you have made repeated demands on the Superintendent of the school for your daughter's release. In your letter to the Superintendent of September 17 you say that Melissa has been confined in the hospital for a long time. This, however, does not appear to have been correct, as the school physician reported during September that Melissa had not been in the hospital since she came to the school, and was then in good physical condition. She was, however, deprived of privileges in the school because of misconduct.

The Supervisor in Charge advises further that

she is not taking advantage of her opportunities, and he does not object to her going home as soon as you send what is required for her transportation. The Office concurs in this and the Superintendent will arrange for her return as soon as you have remitted the necessary amount to him.

is alleged in the communication that was submitted me
with the Office's letter of June the 20th and which is
being attached hereto. Other than this there is no correspondence on file regarding the girl.

It has been learned from Melissa Anderson herself that she was deprived of privileges here in school because of her misconduct and that she then reported the matter to her mother.

In view of the fact that the girl is not taking advantage of her opportunities I shall not object to her going home just as soon as the mother sends what is required to pay for her transportation.
