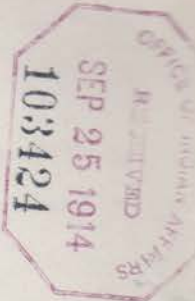

I transmit herewith an application that was placed on file when Charles Pratt was enrolled at Carlisle in 1911. I also enclose correspondence in regard to his re-enrolment, together with an approved application that was submitted by Superintendent Buntin of the Shawnee Agency at my suggestion.

Charles made a splendid record during the three year period of enrolment which terminated at the close of school in June, and believing that students who possess a greater degree of Indian blood than he will not have to be denied admittance here on his account I respectfully request that authority be granted me to enroll him until the close of this school year or until such time that a position as Baker in the Indian School Service can be offered him.
