The Office has received your letter of September 28. enclosing one addressed to you from Mr. O. H. Lipps, Supervisor in Charge of Carlisle School, with reference to your enrollment at that school.

The regulations preclude this Office and Mr. Lipps from receiving pupils of your age and furthermore it has been decided that Indians living in Robson County, North Carolina, should not be admitted to Government Indian schools, owing to the fact that they have for many years been maintaining their own schools, aided by the State and it would be a step backward for the Federal Government to undertake now to educate them.

Owing to these facts, your request to be enrolled at Carlisle School must be denied.
