Guy Dickerson, a one-fourth blood Choctaw from Dallas, Texas, has recently arrived at Carlisle and gives as references Probate Attorney Semple of Durant, Oklahoma, Judge Ferguson and Walter Turnbull of that same city. He is now 22 years of age and desires to be enrolled at Carlisle, although at no time has he been enrolled in any Government School.

In view of the fact that the young man is evidently sincere in his desire to make the best possible use of his opportunities if permission is given him to remain here it is believed that his enrolment should be effected. I respectfully request, therefore, that authority be granted me to keep the young man here and to effect his enrolment.
