My Friend:

In reply to your letter of February 5, making inquiry as to your eligibility to attend a Government non-reservation Indian school, you are advised that there are other conditions or circumstances besides degree of Indian blood which determine the eligibility of pupils for enrollment at a nonreservation school, such as age, health, home convenience to public schools, and whether the facilities in the Indian school are needed for pupils of more than one-quarter degree Indian blood.

It is therefore suggested that you correspond with the Superintendent of the Carlisle School, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, Mr. O. H. Lipps, and make formal application to him for admission to his school. Fill out the enclosed blanks. If you are eligible upon the information furnished Mr. Lipps and he is willing and can accommodate you, the Office will interpose no objection to your enroll-

ment. Under some conditions the regular cost per capita is required, which is \$167.00 per annum.
