Sir:

Upon receipt of the Office's letter of July 26th, 1916, with reference to a report from the Superintendent of the Pine Ridge Agency to the effect that "during the past year six cases of tuberculosis in serious condition were returned to their homes on the Pine Ridge reservation from the Carlisle School with no arrangements for their future care" the Superintendent of that reservation was requested to give the names of the cases reported in order that an appropriate report could be made.
