account of a ruling that a
student must complete the
course before entering another
non reservation.

But my daughter was enrolled
at Senoa in the fall of 1913,
according to the application
which I signed I agreed for
the enrollment of my dau.

for a term of three years, Therefore
it is my understanding ^{that} the
care which the Geneva School
assumed, under signed agreement,
had expired * It appears to me
it would be injustice if any
subsequent ruling, would bar
my daughter from Carlisle.

I infer from the letter of Supt.
Lippo that Supt Lewis states that
Lucy was enrolled in 1914, which
I am sure is a mistake. My dau.
was first enrolled at Geneva in 1909-
1910 - + 1911. in 1912 she attended
the Lantee Mission School and
in 1913 she went back to Geneva.

Please keep Lucy at Carlisle
and take this matter ^{up} with the
Supts concerned soon

I will be very glad if she
can stay where she is with
her brother.

My dear Mrs. Beaver:-

Your daughter Lucy Decora, left here Monday evening and had arrived at Genoa before your letter of the 27th inst reached me. Under the government regulations, Lucy was ineligible for enrolment at this school as she had not completed the course at the Genoa School. We were obliged to send back to Genoa, with Lucy, three other girls, Piegans, who had not completed the course at Genoa, because the rules are enforced very strictly now.

Lucy, while here, proved herself a very desirable pupil and there is nothing to prevent her return to Carlisle after she has completed the prescribed course at Genoa.
