I am returning herewith Green George's letter to you.

Green is one of our North Carolina Cherokee boys at present working on a farm in our outing district. He has agreed with his employer and with the school that he will remain where he is through the summer and we are expecting him to keep his promise.

His case was referred to Superintendent Henderson who advises that he remain on a farm. His time at this school has expired but Mr. Henderson is of the opinion that should he go home now, he is the sort of a fellow who would most likely spend his time on the reservation, loafing.

Green is a good boy but is peculiar. He is always wanting something other than that which he has but is never quite sure what it is he wants. We must always decide for him. He has a fad for writing letters on all subjects. His file at the school is quite full.

When the spring work begins, I will have the outing agent visit him and find out if the amount of work he does warrants more compensation.
