Dear Sir:

If these applications are accepted, please forward transportation for both to Solen, North Dakota. An escort will not be necessary for these pupils as they are fully competent and old enough to travel alone.

I also have an application in letter form from Waldo Gayton of Selfridge, North Dakota. He wishes to know if he and his cousin, William Gayton, can enter Carlisle. They desire to go back with their aunt, Blanche Archambault, who is enrolled in your school. Kindly advise me if you can accept all of these pupils and if so I will have the required applications prepared for Waldo and William Gayton. If the Gaytons are accepted, transportation for them should be placed with the railroad agent at Selfridge, North Dakota.


