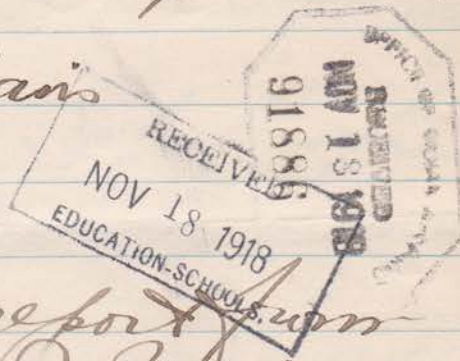

According to last report of
John Franklin Jr, Supt of Indian
School at Carlisle Pa. his report Card
proved him to be out under the
Carlisle dicting System. his report
showed conduct good, health good.
Industry, Industrious. for July 1918.
Since then I have heard nothing
from my son Jacob Jackson whom
I have referred in this letter.

I understand the Carlisle Indian
School is abandoned for Education
of Indians in to preference for disabled
Soldiers of American Expeditionary
force in France.
My son Jacob Jackson is 24 yrs

I age & no doubt he is somewhere
In Jimmys town.

Supt Francis of Indian School informs
we he want back to his Country home
to work.

I am an old man & incapable
of fulfilling my work on my farm.

I have over 100 acres of land, 14 Cows
Milking Dairy, & I would like to find

my son so as to him come home & assist
me in my work. I am building a

Modern barn & ~~\$1500~~^{\$300} valuation for
storage of my Cattle & farm produce.

It seems strange why my son's
disposition of his case was not

officially conveyed to me so that
I may be prepared to attend to same.

No doubt you have records of Carl's
Indian School Students in your charge.

Since its abandonment for Disobedience

Soldiers

Please investigate records of incant
where my son was placed last under
outing system in July 1918 & notify
me accordingly.

My son is entitled to transportation
home and in view of conditions as you are
expressed I shall look to you for
information as to whereabouts of
my son Jacob Jackson.

I have been a chief for over 16
yrs (Sixteen yrs) in this reservation
and I feel I am entitled to some
consideration in this matter in respect
to my son.
