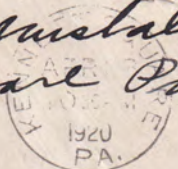

My dear Mrs. Way:-

In reply to your letter of April 3, 1920, with reference to the transportation of Daisy M. Chase to her home in Federal Dam, Minnesota, you are authorized to pay this girl's expenses to her home, if you will, and you will be reimbursed from "Indian Moneys, Proceeds of Labor, Carlisle School". Get a receipt for her Pullman and railroad tickets on the inclosed sub-vouchers and have the girl give a receipt for any money you may advance her for incidentals, such as meals, necessary lodging, etc.

Make out an itemized statement on the inclosed form, attach sub-vouchers to same and send to this Office and you will be reimbursed for the amount expended.


