I respectfully request that authority be granted me to expel Tillie Catfish from this school and to send her to her parents' home at Lac du Flambeau, Wis. This girl has been enrolled at Carlisle since August the 31st of 1909, and is now 19 years of age.

We have had considerable trouble with her during the past several months, and her conduct has become such that she is a menace to the other students who will come in contact with her. This matter had been reported to Superintendent Sickels and he advises that the parents desire her to be returned home.

For the reason that the girl has proved herself to be incorrigible and that it is very necessary that she should be removed at once I respectfully recommend that this matter be given consideration at an early date.
