Sir:

I respectfully submit below a copy of a report that was handed to me by our Disciplinarian on the lith instant regarding a young man who was enrolled at this school on February the 2nd of 1912:

"Paul Jones who has been a student of Carlisle for some time has been put in the Guard House here on several occassions for breaches of school discipline and has on the whole a bad record while here. By his own admission he was in jail on his own reservation for horse stealing and later for fighting his Superintendent. He said that when he came to Carlisle that his departure was a hurried one in order to get away from the Sheriff at his home who had 24 counts against him for bootlegging whiskey on the Umatilla Reservation."

In view of the fact that he has finally proven himself entirely unworthy of the help that he has been given here and has become so incorrigible that he is a bad influence among the boys who have to associate with
