Sir :

Answering your letter of the 19th instant, relative to the rules and restrictions under which Indian girls from the Carlisle School are placed in homes for service, you are advised that your communication has been referred to Superintendent Friedman, who will give you the information desired.

I may say, however, that it is not the policy of the school to send girls as far away as Massachusetts, for the reason that an agent from the school visits them in their home at least twice a year, and at such a distance this oversight would be impracticable.

Students from the school at Hampton, Virginia, are placed in homes in Massachusetts during the summer, and possibly in the winter, to learn housekeeping duties. You might correspond with the Principal of the School, Dr. H. B. Frissell.
