Sir:

Robert Doyle and Jesse Gilleski, two students from this school, ran away from their Outing homes on June 5th, last. Shortly after that they were arrested by the police of Paterson, N. J., and when the school was notified, were returned to Carlisle.

The "farming out" reported by certain news sheets was nothing else than the selection of homes for the boys under our Outing System and where the boys are visited regularly by the Outing Agent. The incident was an ordinary case of discipline and one that frequently occurs where boys are getting their first summer's experience away from the school, and where their separation from school friends and school activities has a tendency to make them homesick and restless.

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TWO CARLISLE INDIAN STUDENTS LOCKED UP.

Held at Paterson Awaiting School Authorities' Arrival.

PATERSON, June 16.—Two young student of the Indian Industrial School at Carlisle, Pa., are being held here pending the arrival of friends who are to take them back to school. They were found strolling along Market street by a policeman, who took them to headquarters, where they were made comfortable. They are both about 14 years old.

One of the youngsters said he was Robert Doyle and that he hailed from Lodge Grass, Mont. He said his mother was a half-breed and his father a white man. The other wanderer is a full-blooded Indian. He gave the name of Jesse Gilleski, and said he was from North Carolina. He said he had gone to Carlisle from the Cherokee Reservation.

The boys told the police they had been bound out to a farmer in Bridgeville, Warren county, N. J., but that they thought they were not treated properly, and so decided to return to the Carlisle school.
