Referring to Office letter of November 1, 1909, Education-Administration, 84510-1909, regarding the application of Francis E. Smith for permission to be enrolled at Carlisle School, I have the honor to report that this Indian was directed by Superintendent Friedman to secure permission from your Office for his enrollment at Carlisle School. He is over 21 years of age. As far as I know he is prospectively a good subject for transfer, but as I understand it, ^{this is} not allowable except by permission secured from your Office. I therefore respectfully request that such permission be given as the young man presents a good appearance, and I believe would make good use of his opportunities to secure a better education.
