Sir:

This is to report to the Office that Paul Vargas, a Carribee Indian from the District of Humacao, Porto Rico, has been admitted to Carlisle as a student, and that he has been detailed to work under the same privileges as other students.

Mr. Rockey, the bearer of Office letter of July 5th, was informed that a sum of \$167.00 would have to be paid annually for the boy's board, tuition and clothing, and \$40.00 to apply to that amount has already been deposited.

As it is desirable that a limited number of such special students be given the privilege to enroll at Carlisle, I respectfully request that my action in this case be approved.
