John Connell, an Indian of Reserve, Kansas, has to-day made a request that the three children of his brother, Willie Connell, also of Reserve, Kansas, who are now enrolled at Carlisle, be transferred to Haskell for enrollment there. The three children's names are Julia, Edward and Alvana.

John Connell says that his brother's children are full-blood Indians; that he desires their return to Haskell so that they will be near his home, and he will be able to have them assist him in his farm work during the summer, and that he will pay for their transportation from Carlisle to Haskell.

If this transfer is agreeable to you and to
Superintendent Wise of Haskell, with whom you may correspond, you may take up the matter directly with Willie
Connell, of Reserve, Kansas. Should there be some objection, you may report to this differential your recommendations.
