I respectfully request that authority be granted me to return Peter Cook to his home at Hogansburg, N. Y.

This boy is a member of the Iroquois tribe and was enrolled here in November of 1904 for a five year term.

His grandmother now makes a request thru the Rev. Mr. John Tagg of Hogansburg that the boy should be sent home without delay; claiming that his services are required at her home.

In view of the general policy of the Office regarding the Indian pupils from New York State and as per the request made by this boy's relative, I respectfully recommend that the authority requested above be granted me.
