Sir:

The Office has received your letter dated April 10, 1910, requesting that your son, Mitchell Pierce, be returned to immediately from the Carlisle Indian School for the reason that it is necessary for you to have his help. The Office notes also the letter enclosed with your communication received by you from the Superintendent at Carlisle, in which you are advised that Mitchell Pierce's period of enrollment will terminate during the term ending June 1910, when arrangement will be made to send him home.

There is nothing in your letter to show that the circumstances governing your request that the boy be returned immediately are serious and urgent; and if it were permitted, and if the Superintendent at Carlisle were permitted to return pupils whenever parents requested this, the discipline of the school could not be maintained. It is, therefore, believed best that Mitchell Pierce remain in the school for the short time between this and the end of the term in June, 1910.
