Sir:

On April 28, 1910, you wrote a letter to this Office asking that your daughter Nancy Connors, who has been at Carlisle for four years, be returned home for the summer vacation. This letter was referred to the Superintendent at Carlisle for his consideration and report.

The Superintendent's report shows that he wrote you May 17, telling you of his intention to grant your request in consideration of your appreciation of what has been done for your daughter at Carlisle. He told you also that it would be necessary to deposit \$25 to cover the transportation both ways, to insure her return expenses when her vacation should be over.

Your letter of May 30, addressed to the Department of the Interior, on this subject, has also been received, but it seems that no action can be taken by the Office, and indeed

no action is necessary unless you deposit the \$25 required by Superintendent Friedman. He will doubtless send your daughter as soon as he receives the money for he has already promised to do so.

In view of the fact that you are so appreciative of what has been done for your daughter during her enrolment at Carlisle and because I am of the opinion that a vacation for her would mean a continuation of that training she has been receiving here, your request has been given special consideration and it has been decided to grant what you desire.

In order that there may be no delay in arranging your daughter's transportation after the close of school, you will please deposit sufficient funds with me to insure her return expenses. An amount of \$25.00 will cover the transportation both ways.

The Outing system of said institution.

I am much gratified to learn that she has a good home & ^{that} every thing is being done to promote her in her studies & afford her all the opportunities granted by the school.

I am thankful for everything that is being ^{done} for my daughter in Carlisle School.

The refusal of Mr. Friedman was a firm but a polite one, & I am going to appeal from his decision to this Dept. for a recognition of my request.

Four years ago when my daughter
left here for Carlisle, I did not
signed or filled out any application
blank for her in order to have
her Admitted to Carlisle school.
When the Party left here at
the time for Carlisle, under the
Charge of Mr. Peter Cole, I
gave my permission reluctantly
at the last moment for 3 years
(three years) to Mr Cole in the
Dept. at Massena Springs.
I can ~~now~~ produce a
Sworn Statement to that
effect if need be.

five years away.

retarding her in her studies.
