The Honorable, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D. C.

Sir:

Referring to Office letter of December 13th and the contents of the request submitted with it, this is to report that Nancy Conners was returned to school from her country home the latter part of November, in order that she could be given treatment for trachoma. After an operation and after two weeks of treatment in the school hospital, she was again allowed to go back to her home in the country. This was not allowed until assurance was received from her patron that treatment would be given Nancy at regular stated intervals. For the present the girl can not attend public school, but she should be able to do so within a reasonable length of time.

Our records indicate that Mancy's period of enrollment will terminate at the close of school in June of 1911, and as the girl is receiving valuable training
