At present there are no Indian children to be placed in private homes, as Carlisle School has been turned over to the War Department and all students transferred to other Government schools except those placed in homes under the outing system prior to the closing of the school.

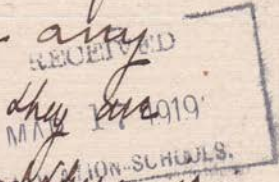
