Memorandum of Justification

This statement is corroborated by professional foresters and entomologists who propose to give the trees their particular personal attention.

Tree surgery is no doubt an important feature in connection with landscape gardening, forestry, etc., and assuming that the Superintendent's statement is correct as to the number of trees needing attention, there is no doubt that the repair work should be done immediately.

Sir:

I respectfully transmit under this cover, correspondence relative to the improvement of the trees and the preservation of the forest growth on the school grounds, which has been under consideration by the Peters, Byrne and Company, expert foresters.

The investigation which they made and the estimate herewith transmitted, was done without any cost or obligation to the Government, and I respectfully transmit it herewith with the recommendation that the work be done. There are a large number of trees on the ground, most of which are quite old, and practically all of them need expert attention. It seems to me that the estimate made for the entire work, including materials, of \$239.25, is a reasonable one. There is no one competent on the grounds to do this work. It requires the services of an expert forester.
