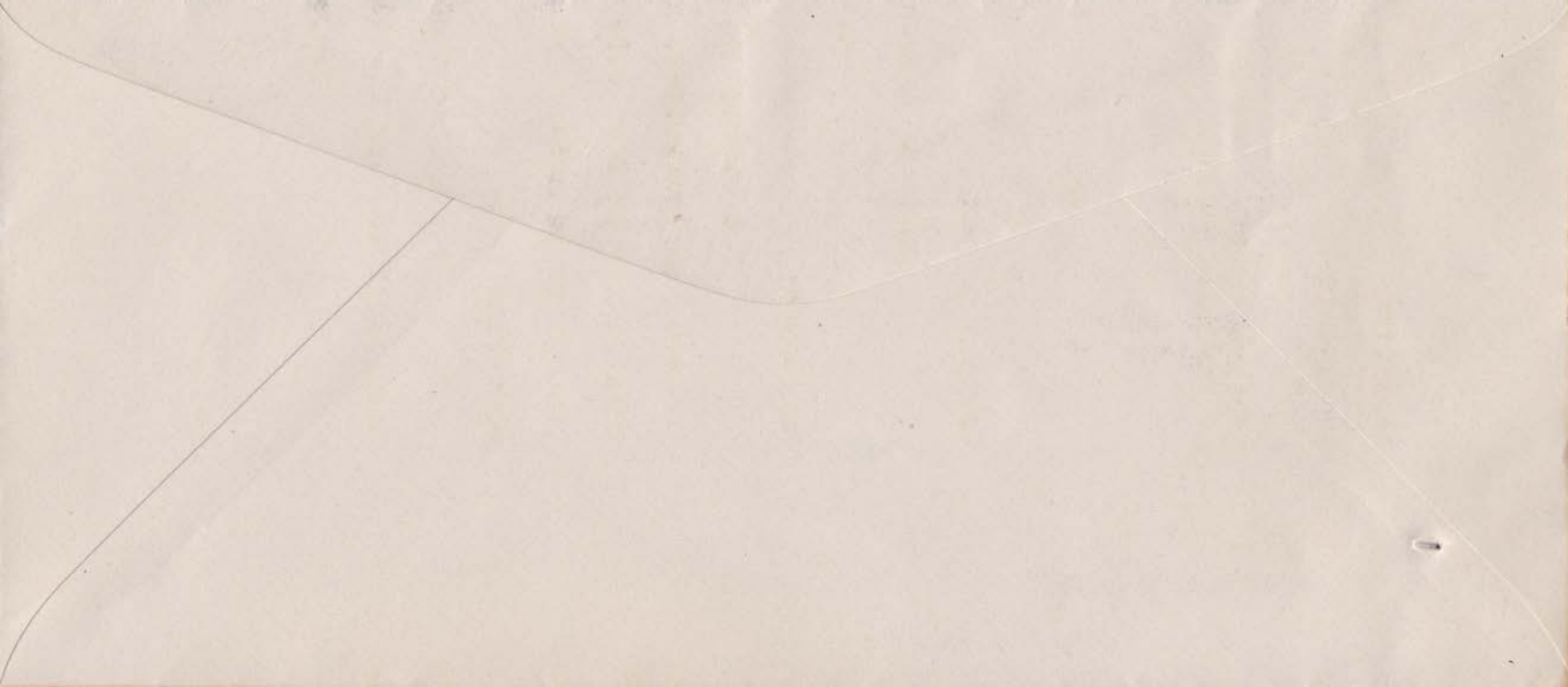

We are in receipt of a letter from Hon. Carmi Thompson relative to a motion picture film covering interesting items at the Carlisle Indian School. These pictures were secured late last week through the kindness of the superintendent there.

We wrote Mr. Thompson some days ago stating that it was our purpose to present you with a copy of this film and this will be done within a few days. Should you find the subject matter and quality of this film of sufficient interest to warrant your purchasing other copies we will be pleased to make these up for you at the rate of ten cents a foot, including titles. This would make practically a thousand feet of film, and would require about twenty minutes for projecting.

The print we are sending you does not contain any titles, but we are sure it will be sufficiently clear. One of the most interesting portions, the one we propose to use this week in the Animated Weekly, is that of a young Indian girl, in costume, singing "Nearer My God To Thee," in the universal Indian sign language. There is also a pose from three Indian students who will participate in the Olympic Games at Stockholm.
