I have the honor to report that twenty eight (28) Children left this Agency yesterday for Carlisle Penna. twenty of whom were boys and eight were girls - These belonged to the two tribes as follows.

Cheyennes. 12 Boys 4 girls Total 18
Arapahois 6 Boys, 4 Girls. Total 10.

Seeing very soon after the Call was made on the Indians for children for this school, that a number far greater than was authorized would be offered, and the desire to send was so urgent, that I telegraphed your office and obtained permission to send twenty five instead of fifteen

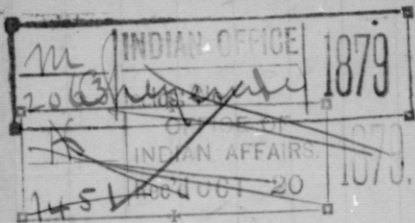
