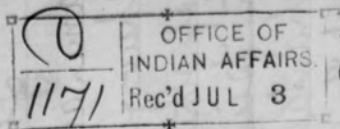

tin ware. such as coffee boilers. funnels. Cups. pails &c
that were made by the Indians at the Carlisle
School.

I have the honor to report, that I have examined
the same, and find them very good, being well made,
they show full as good workmanship as any that I have
seen of other makes. And are much better than most
of the pieced tin ware put upon the market as
merchandise goods. And I would respectfully
suggest that the Carlisle School could make all the
tin ware, your Department may need at its next call
for supplies. For I have no doubt that the pieced
tin ware made by said School. will fill the wants
of your different agencies. Full as well if not better
than the stamped ware. generally offered and
accepted by your Department
