Sir,

Referring to your letter of the 23<sup>rd</sup> inst  
marked "A Miscellaneous P. 414, 1880" I have  
the honor to state that my Retained Descriptive  
Statement of proposed changes of Employees, dated  
March 16<sup>th</sup> bears the name Jennie L. Woodbury  
as commencing service March 11<sup>th</sup> and it should  
have so appeared on the statement forwarded and  
that is the date her service began. It will be  
necessary to confirm Miss Woodbury at \$45<sup>00</sup> per  
month or not at all. I shall not be able to secure  
Teachers, competent to do even fair work, at any less  
than that. I find it no easy matter to obtain good  
teachers.
