Sir

We need a light one horse Carriage to transact our business with the town and surrounding Country.

I request your authority to construct one in our own shops, at an outlay of not to exceed \$15.00 for material. This will give us a covered, jump seat, Carriage for two or four persons; in all respects a good article, such as would cost at the factory here \$150.00. My Blacksmith and Wagon maker is competent to build such a Carriage, and in the building of it, will give many lessons to the five apprentices under his instruction.
