Friend Charlie,

I got your letter yesterday. I am much obliged to you for writing and am glad to be remembered by old "Spot" and Red Cloud. Now Charlie if the Indians want to come to our house they can do it if they will get Roubidoux and Primeaux to telegraph or write to Col. Boudinot Clerk of Committee House of Representatives asking him to see the Secretary and get his permission for them to come. Now what I want you to do is to be sure to bring the Indians to the Washington House and then I am sure the Secy will say they can stay. All I want is for you, Roubidoux and Primeaux to say that if the Indians don't stop at the

Washington Howard they want to go
right home, & I will be at the Depot
to meet you all and will take you to
your old home and make you all
comfortable and happy. As soon as I
see you I will tell you just what to
do. If the Indians have not left
when you get this letter you must
tell ~~Perrin~~ & ~~Rowland~~ to send
that telegraph to Col. Bondine at
once. Hoping to soon see you I
