TRAINING SCHOOL FOR INDIAN YOUTH,

CARLISLE BARRACKS,

Carlisle, Pa., Aug 18<sup>th</sup>, 1880.

To the  
Hon Commissioner of Indian Affairs  
Washington D. C

Sir.

Bishop Huntington Episcopal Bishop  
of Central New York, who has in course of education  
at Paris Hill in his diocese, four of the former  
Florida prisoners, desires to send two of them here  
to be instructed in trades, provided he is allowed  
to pay their way and retain some direction over them  
with a view to their becoming teachers and instructors  
among their people hereafter. I should be very  
glad to have these boys here, and would recommend  
that I be allowed to receive them at the rate of one  
hundred <sup>Dollars</sup> each per year, the sum fixed by the  
Department in such cases with Rev. Sheldon  
Jackson
