TRAINING SCHOOL FOR INDIAN YOUTH,

CARLISLE BARRACKS,

Carlisle, Pa., Sept. 27th, 1880

To the Honorable
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs
Washington D. C.

Sir.

In reply to yours of Sept. 15th marked "W
Miscell. Kellogg" I have to inform you that I have
just seen Dr. W. H. Hepburn who is willing to
undertake our medical work, will reside upon the
ground, give his whole time and attention to the
health of the school, and give the students a
Lecture about the care of the body and the preservation
of their health once each week for the sum of Nine
hundred dollars (\$900.⁰⁰) per year, the Government
to supply the necessary stores.

I am very favorably impressed with Dr. Hepburn
and esteem the value of his constant presence on the
ground well worth the salary he asks. The weekly
Lecture to the children will be valuable to the school,
and I would respectfully request your authority
to employ him at the rates named.
