To the Honorable
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs
Washington D. C.

Sir,

I have the honor to inform you that the Yellow Wash on the Walls of the buildings, which has been on for fourteen years, is worn away in many places, exposing the brick, and giving the buildings, a very shabby appearance, besides losing the quality of protection, it formerly had. We have completed the painting of the roofs, and are now engaged in painting the outside Wood work. It seems necessary to complete the work, by giving the brick work, a coat of Wash, and it is also desirable to change the color. I have about one hundred fifty Dollars, saved from the amount allowed me, for the purchase of Coal, and would request your authority, to expend that, or as much of it, as may be necessary for the purpose above named
