Dear Sir

At the request
of some Creek Indians, not
living within the limits of
their own reservation, I write
to you, to inquire the condi-
tions under which scholars
may be admitted to the
school under your charge.

So widely has the reputation
of your school spread, that
the parents of children who
have had the children at Mission
are anxious to have them sent
where, as they say, "They may
learn something useful, and
not only singing &c"

that Seminoles and Creeks
wish to have some children
put in your charge. Notwith-
standing that they have some
sort of school advantages
home.

If it is not inconsistent
with the regulations the
Seminoles would wish to
enter some children.

This request however is as
aforestated made on the
part of Creek children,
who, not living within their
own limits, have no opportu-
nities for education.

Please write giving me
the conditions, rules,
fee &c under which the
scholars may be entered,
if permissible.
