Sir:

I have the honor to report that the transfer of this Post to the custody and control of the Interior Dept. was completed this day. Duplicate Invoices and receipts, giving appraised value of articles and the totals, of all movable property selected by the Representatives of the Interior Department, were passed. Other movable property and the records of the Post have been disposed of in accordance with instructions received. Duplicate Invoices and receipts for the Buildings were passed and one receipt has been sent to the Chief Quartermaster Dept of the East. The deed for the Reservation and also that for a lot in the Ashland Cemetery near Carlisle Pa., have been passed to the Representatives of the Interior Department.

Sir:

In compliance with instructions from your office of September 2. 1879, relative to the transfer of Carlisle Barracks, Pa., to the Department of the Interior, I have the honor to report that the post Quartermaster under date of the Dock. instant reports the transfer of the public buildings at that post was completed on the 9th of September 1879, by receipt of Lieut. R. K. Pratt, 100<sup>th</sup> Regt. U.S. A., as Agent for the Dept<sup>of the</sup> Interior, therefor; and the movable property pertaining to the Quartermasters Department selected by the representative of the Dept<sup>of the</sup> Interior has been likewise transferred with invoices giving value of each article as fixed by the Board of Officers convened for that purpose under Special Order No 179. H. O. S. Dept of the East, the aggregate value being: Regular Supplies \$1064.84; Incidental Expenses. \$210.43; Barracks <sup>and</sup> Quarters \$128.44; Army Transportation \$455.11.

and C. Capt Garrison Equipage \$245.38.  
Total \$2,104.20. All of the remaining  
property that was serviceable has been  
transferred and shipped to the Post Quar-  
termaster at Fort M. Henry, Md., and  
the unserviceable, condemned and disposed  
of in accordance with recommendation  
of the Inspecting Officer.

The records of the Post Quartermaster's  
Office have been forwarded to the Quar-  
termaster General's Office.

I would add that one copy of the  
Report of the Board of Officers referred to  
above was forwarded to your office by the  
Chief Quartermaster Department of the East,  
with recommendation that it be forwarded  
to Washington for adjustment by the heads  
of the proper Bureau.

No. 52. }

1. Private *Jay C. Doro*, of the General Service Detachment at these Headquarters, will be discharged the service of the United States, to date the 31st instant. He will receive immediately his discharge papers and be paid at once the usual pay and commutation of rations, and fuel up to the date fixed for his discharge.

2. Pursuant to instructions from the General of the Army, dated August 22, 1879, the post of Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, will be transferred to the custody and control of the Interior Department, to be used as a school for the education of Indian children; reserving, however, the right of the War Department to resume occupation of Carlisle Barracks whenever needed for military purposes, or when required by Congressional action.

The present commanding officer of Carlisle Barracks, 1st Lieutenant *E. T. C. Richmond*, 2d Artillery, is charged with the execution of the transfer of the post under the above instructions to such officer as may be designated by the Interior Department to receive it. He will take receipts, in duplicate, for the buildings and property transferred, and to that end will at once proceed to make an accurate inventory thereof, noting on the inventory their present condition. Detailed instructions will be issued hereafter in regard to the disposition of the detachment now on duty at the post, and of such public property as it may be necessary to remove therefrom.
