


The Captain of Plymouth

ARGUMENT.



It later develops that at the time Standish and Erasmus were held in captivity by the Indians, Standish promised to marry the Indian Princess Katonka, daughter of the great Chief Wattawamut, if she would set them free; and because of his breach of promise he is prohibited from marrying Priscilla and commanded to wed Katonka, by Elder Brewster, who also decrees that John shall have Priscilla.
