Jan. 16, 1888.

Dear friend R. W. Patt.

I have receive your letter last night and was glad to hear from you. That you say in your letter about me I did not get up earlier morning.

Now I am going to tell you about what I doing here in this place. I have to get up every half past 4 O'clock, and I have to go to work in the morning. I feed 36 steers, 6 cows, 43 sheep, 28 hogs chickens, 6 horse, and every morning I turn out in the barnyard 78 blocks and next I clean the stable, I give bed steers, I pump the trough full of

of water for the steers, and next
I shell corn 30 bushels before 9 o'clock.
blocks in the morning, and
then my work is all done.

I am going to school every day
with white children. School here
this fall, and I play with
white children we will play
ball. Now let me tell you another
thing I have been here this place
I never do any thing and I
never get wrong. I am trying
to be a good man all the time
this fall, and every body white
men likes me this fall.
