I have very little to do in the summer time only sailing hunting and sporting but not much hunting to do except Bear. Winter time I like it best for then there are foxes to trap and shoot and chase. I trap on an Island called

"Deer Island" there are three or more different kind of fox on the Island the Silver Gray fox, Cross fox, Red fox and we suppose there are Black fox too and you bet they are gold to us.

Dear Mrs. Denny;-

My friend the Carlisle paper comes to me every month four at a time and I see your name, it is always in the paper, so while I have a pen in my hand I that of so many people to write to and between writting letters I thought of you and here it is, what you think of that? or this hand scribbling any way after leaving school?

After I left Carlisle I had
had you and Mr. Denny in mind
and the whole Carlisle family
has been in my mind for that
matter, all this time although
I have not been writing to
you and the School paper
is always a treat to me
and when it gets here I have
to wait too long for it because
it is sent to Belkofsky, while
my address is Kings Cove.

I am married and my wifes
name is Polly and I have two
boys Nicolas and Esiah is their
names besides I have an orphan
girl in hand to care for.

We are all well and happy,
If dose not count any way if
I would been at Carlisle school
over again I would sure

start work and finish it dif-
ferent than I have, any way
I am very thankful from what
I recieved while there.

I work for the Pacific American
fisheries in the summer and
trap for fur in the winter.

It is very cold here now and
this evening while out I al-
most had my fingers frozen
off, that is to say I was out
clam digging.

How are you all? I will now
close with best wishes to you
all I am the same friend

Dear Esiah:

I was very much pleased to get a letter from you yesterday. The Alaskan mail which came in yesterday, brought me two letters from my Alaskan friends, yours and Katharyn Dyakanoff's. She is now Mrs. Sellar and her address is Unalaska. She is still teaching in the service of the Bureau of Education. She has three little children, she tells me.

I feel like a "grandmother" when I get letters from the old pupils telling me of their little children. I can hardly imagine our little Esiah with two little sons. But aren't you happy with them? We have one little boy, Wallace Robertson, and we think he is about right. He is $2\frac{1}{2}$ years old now and full of life and mischief, just like his father, I say. We bought him a little Shetland pony the other day and are having a buggy and a set of harness made. We will have some great rides this spring and summer, if all goes well.

Michael Chabitnoy wrote me a card the other day. He makes his home in Pennsylvania altogether now. He married a white girl and lives near Lebanon, Pa. He used to visit here quite frequently but since his marriage, I presume he is too busy providing for his family.

William Foster is also settled in the east, I think. He married a Philadelphia girl and lives in the city. He has a little brother Charlie here in school now. He still works in the Reading railroad shops, William does.

You get the Arrow and keep yourself acquainted with what goes on at Carlisle I believe. We have had some trouble here but I hope we may get on our feet again. There are many changes taking place all the time, I hope for the best. I must close now. I hope to hear from you again sometime. With best wishes to you and your family, I am
