I never attended any school after leaving Carlisle. When I left Carlisle, I went right up to Dawson City, spent two years at Dawson and from Dawson, I went to Nome City. I was among the first few that found the gold at Nome.

I am now working with the mechanics getting \$3.75 for 8 hours work. I own two homes, one at Metlahkahla and one at Ketchikan. They are cottages, one has nine rooms, the other four rooms. These two homes are built by my own hands. I also own a gasoline boat, 35 feet long, 9 ft. beam, 12 horse power Union engine. I own two lots at Ketchikan. I deposit \$900.

I have never been in the Indian Service.

When I first left the school, I came up here in a few days. I got a job keeping books at Guvian Saw Mill. I held the job until the mill burned down.

I am sorry to say that I have not done much for the betterment of my people. The reason is this, since I left old Carlisle, I have been among the whites. I spent four years up north looking for gold. When I came down from the gold fields, I build a nice home at Metlahkahtla, Alaska but there is nothing for me to do ~~there~~ so I built another home at this place. I am here now working every day. So you see the reason why I have not done much to help my people.

I am a citizen of the United States. I got my second paper in the Superior Court of the State of Washington. You see I am not going back to the blanket. I am just as good as any white man at this place. I own a nice home good enough for any king or the president of the U.S. to stay. I thank old Carlisle very much for what it has done for me, I will say that much.
