I having a hard battle to fight every day. Sometimes I almost get discouraged in life that is in line of Christian work. But I always ask God to help me, I am fishing in a Gas boat 36 ft long with 12 horse power Standard engine. And she makes between 7 or 8 miles an hour. This summer was a hard luck summer for me and my wife Our dear little died on the 2th of June, and I am a deep sorry everyday. But since I received your letter I feel much better, the you have never forget me. We got another letter ^{too} and he is very well too and the ^{boy} can do any thing for his now. This is all I have to tell you from your dear old Carlisle friend. Oh! Just wish I could get the whole paper now.
