as the tribe were the prisoner of war. they were not yet have any land. for we know not what the Govt is going to do. every family has its <sup>own</sup> house. <sup>of cattle</sup> numerous

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each?

*no, never*  
been in the Indian service, at no time. never did try to get any position from Govt, but go around among the white people, and always found something to do.



8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? *never been in any kind of position, since leaving Carlisle.*

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

*I have favor note, which has come to my hand, and was very glad indeed, and to know, that dear old Carlisle still remembers me.*

*when have received your kindly letter, it reminds me, as though I was at Carlisle again, and have deep feeling, wishing, how I could be at Carlisle, again, so I determine, to write you, a short note, to let you know how glad I was.*

*Fort Sill reservation containing nothing but the Indian cattle, what they called, apache cattle, we have over fifty thousand cattle here at Fort Sill reservation, we generally brand the calves every summer, and it is almost time, to round up the cattle, its lot of funds, when they brand the calves, we brand every year about twenty five thousand calves, during in the fall, we ship six or seven hundred head of steers, when they get their cattle, money, some of the Indians, gets, eight hundred dollars, some of them three four hundred. But I do not know, where all that money go to, they do not know, how to save their money.*
