here in New York.

I have six horses & 3  
sheeps, and I got a  
wife and two children.

and I got money enough  
to last me for a while  
I got amount of a total  
of \$11008.70 this year.

So I hope all my  
old friends will still  
remember me, and for  
the farmers who I am  
to work for.
