3. Did you attend or graduate from any other schools after leaving Carlisle? *No.* Give names of schools and dates if possible,

4. What is your present occupation?

United States Scout

5. Tell something of your present home,

My home is in a part of Fort Apache, where the detachment of U. S. Indian Scouts are quartered; I have a comfortable home.

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings or money do you have?

I have about ten acres of land, all under cultivation, thirty head of cattle, twelve head of stock, wagon and harness.

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each?

Yes, Twelve years as Indian interpreter, White River Agency, Two years as Father's ranger, White River Agency, One year as Agency Police, White River Agency.

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? I have some knowledge as store-keeper, as I have held that position at various times, and have held positions of trust while in the capacity of clerk.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life: At present I am enlisted in the United States Indian Scouts stationed at Fort Apache, Ariz. I am satisfied, and like the service, am in good health, and have never been ill, since I left Carlisle; about sixteen years ago. About eight years ago I visited Carlisle, and was well pleased with my visit, and would like very much to visit Carlisle again. I have four children, three girls and one boy, their health at present will not permit their attending school.

I own a Singer sewing machine and have it at my home, where my wife is becoming very skillful in sewing.

While attending Carlisle my name was Sabon Soc Jim, but is now Sabon S James, and am registered as such, by the Indian Agent at White River, Ariz.
