Willie Adams, who is referred to in your letter of the Elst instant, was formerly a student at this school.

After an absence from Carlisle for a number of years he returned to the Borough more than a year ago and was employed in various capacities until the beginning of last July. Of an amount of \$125.00 he had at that time \$85.00 had to be expended by him to settle with a negro woman in Carlisle who had brought serious charges against him, and what was left must have been expended since for liquor.

Adams has property in Oklahoma and should soon receive another remittance. It is suggested, therefore, that you refer your inquiry to Mr. C. V. Stincheoum, Superintendent of the Kiewa Indian Agency at Anadarko, Oklahoma, with a view of having funds made available from which to pay your Association for treatment that has been and is being given him and for any other needs that may arise.


