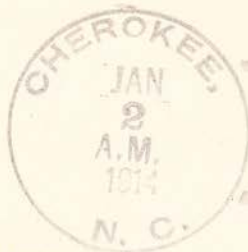

2. What is your present address? Cherokee N.C.

3. Did you attend or graduate from any other schools after leaving Carlisle? None Give names of schools and dates if possible. _____

4. What is your present occupation? My present occupation is farming

5. Tell something of your present home. We live in the Soos valley. We have three children. Two can talk good Carlisle English

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings or money do you have? Down here we hold the land in common, but I am in favor

of allotments at an early date. I own two milk cows, one mule, and six chickens. We live in a frame house that I built myself. it has two rooms, one sleeping room the other kitchen

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? I was a bandmaster and Policeman at Cherokee Training school last year under Supt. Frank Kesselka; had to give up on account of my health.

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? *none,*

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life: *Two years^{ago} I was elected a delegate to represent my town.*

This year I am cultivating some eight acre in corn, sweet potatoes, Irish potatoes, beans, pumpkins and melons.

We have a little garden where raised, onions, lettuce, cabbage, turnips, pie plant, sweet corn, beets, ^{red} pepper, peas and beans.

I am in receipt of your letter of January 6th enclosing therewith 5¢ which it appears you understand you were due this school. I have to advise that we merely wanted to know if you had in your possession a check for 3¢ which was issued to you in order to close out the balance in your account at this school. Since you are unable to locate this check we will necessarily have to close out this 3¢ in some other way.
