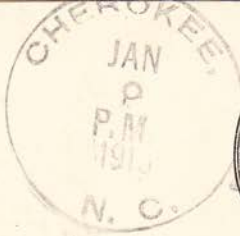

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings or money do you have? I have about \$8000 Dollars worth of property, I made 100 Buckels of corn last year this was plenty for my family consist four child.

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? I have not been in the Indian Service after leaving Carlisle

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? I was engaged on railroad works in Tennessee soon after leaving Carlisle. I was employed as assistant Powder-man doing blasting till in Dec 23rd 1868 I went to make living for my self.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I have been well all the time since I left Carlisle. I have been trying to get up some student to go to Carlisle. My brother who wanted to go to that school but on account of his sore and sick eyes it has been impossible to have him to go. I have seen some of the boys from Carlisle all are well, some say they expect to return to Carlisle this fall.
