 348Vahnomen county is again in the throes of a political campaign, and there are several candidates for each office, among these appear the vames of several members of this reservation.

If the members of the reservation within Mahnomen county wish to be represented in the county offices of Mabnomen county they should not repeat their performance of two years ago; if they are defeated by members of the reservation at the primaries none of them should be induced to put up another reservation candidate against them to split the reservation vote.

The most importarit offices in the county from the tax payers point of view, are the county commissioners, and those in favor of reducing taxes should see that the proper persons are elected for these offices and not persons who are always seeking to find some way to raise funds by bonding the county.

We are at present one of the heaviest tax payers in Mahnomen county' and our interest in county affairs lead us to make the suggestions we are making,

We believe members of the reservation would make good officials, but after the experience of two years ago we doubt whether any of them will be elected this year.
We notice in the announcements the names of two reservation candidates for the office of sheriff, namely; W. A. Burnette and Frank Cajune. Both of them woula make good officers, but as they are running for the same office both cannot be elected.
Erank Cajune is a recent removal to this reservation and has been a justice of peace at Mahnomen for several years. He has the reputation of having made a good justice.

William Burnette we hare known since his early childhood, and he comes from one of the oldest mixed-blood families among the Chippewas. He has been a suloon keeper and at this time there may be some prejudice against him on this account, but being a joung man of goou sense and believing there is a better way of getting along in this world than selling whiskey, he gave up the business entirely some time ago. His habits are good and he is firm of purpose. and for this reason is well qualified to make a good sheriff.

Already there has been some criticism of Mr. Burnette's candidacy, but the fact that he once kept a salonn should not be a sufficient reason to condemn him throughout his future life, but he should be given an opportunity to make good by placing him in a position where he will be thrown in conlact with prominant officials and good influences. It must be borne in mind that he is an Indian and has not had the same opportunities that white mer have had, and for this reason he should be given a fair chance. Members of this reservation can elect him if the.
